# Overview

- \$2,859,649
- Purpose: Provide crisis intervention services, mental and substance use disorder treatment and other related recovery supports for children and adults impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Eligible Applicants:

- Licensed Mental Health Centers
- State-Approved Substance-Use Disorder Treatment Providers

## How the grant is structured:

- **70%** to individuals with serious mental illness (SMI), substance use disorder (SUD), or co-occurring SMI and SUDs;
- **20%** to individuals with less severe mental health disorders; and
- **10%** to *healthcare practitioners with mental health needs*
  - *Allocated separately to the University of Montana*
- **Both adults and youth** may be served by this funding

# What services can be funded?

- Services for individuals who are uninsured, underinsured, or otherwise lack the ability to pay
- Services lacking an existing funding source
- PPE for staff—not clients

# What services can be funded?

- Evidence-based
- Telehealth accessible
- Wide Scope:
  - *Screening and assessment*
  - *Treatment services*
  - *Recovery support services*
  - *Individual support services*
  - *Crisis services*

- **Grant Term:** February 1, 2021—May 31, 2022
- **Request for Proposal is TBD**, but goal is:
  - Release date: May 1, 2021
  - Closure date: June 1, 2021
  - Contracts effective: July 1, 2021—May 31, 2022

- Monthly Invoicing
- Monthly Data Reporting:
  - Unduplicated number of individuals receiving services
- GPRA (Government Performance and Results Act)
  - Required for all behavioral health treatment and recovery services
  - AMDD will provide support
