Proof of ID/Income/Residency

Staff

Use this form when proof of ID, income (does not include zero income), or residency documentation does not exist or if using pending proof for income.

Examples:

- 1. The person works for cash.
a. Enter the self-reported household income and assess if it meets WIC Eligibility guidelines.
b. Select "Statement of Income" for proof of income.
2. Documentation was destroyed in a house fire or natural disaster.
3. Participant is homeless or migrant.
4. Participant has ID and residency proofs but is pending income proof.
5. Other reasons may qualify on a case-to-case basis. Please contact State Office.

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To file a program discrimination complaint, a Complainant should complete a Form AD-3027, USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form which can be obtained online at: <https://www.usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ad-3027.pdf>, from any USDA office, by calling (866) 632-9992, or by writing a letter addressed to USDA. The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
