State Agency Responsibility for Civil Rights Compliance

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) is a federally funded program committed to assuring that CACFP benefits are made available to all eligible individuals without regard to race, color, national origin, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), age or disability as stated in 7 CFR 226.6(m)(1): Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin in programs and activities receiving Federal financial assistance; Americans with Disability Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibiting discrimination on the basis of disability; Title IX of the Education amendments of 1972 prohibiting discrimination on the basis of sex; and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age.

The State agency provides civil rights training to all new CACFP SA employees.

The State agency provides civil rights training annually to all of its institutions participating in the CACFP.

The State agency publishes a CACFP media press release annually to notify the public of institutions participating in the CACFP, on behalf of all institutions participating in CACFP. These media releases are posted on the CACFP website at the time of release and are retained there for a minimum of one year.
