

Montana Do Not Board Procedures

1. Local health department, hospital(s), or provider(s) notifies CDEpi of an individual who is at risk to travel while infectious with a communicable disease—this includes airline/transportation staff who may wish to travel while working.

Communicable diseases of high concern in travelers – there are additional diseases of concern listed in the complete CSTE guidance below, but please notify CDEpi immediately of travelers who wish to travel with these diseases:

- Cholera
- Diphtheria
- Measles
- Meningococcal disease
- Novel influenza with potential to cause pandemic
- Pertussis
- Plague
- Severe acute respiratory syndromes
- Rubella
- Smallpox
- TB
- Varicella
- Viral hemorrhagic fevers
- Yellow fever

2. CDEpi will contact the Seattle Quarantine Station (QS) to discuss and decide if a Do Not Board should be considered.
3. CDEpi calls LHJ, healthcare providers, and additional persons involved in the respective state to provide further information.

- Patient name and DOB
 - Travel details: information for flights, train, cruise ship, bus, overland border crossing, etc.
 - Including seat numbers, layovers
 - Lab results and reports
 - Testing date
 - Provider notes
 - Medications
 - LHJ notes
 - Symptoms
 - Onset date
4. QS schedules a meeting with CDC staff.
 5. Before QS meeting, CDEpi meets with LHJ, medical healthcare providers, and additional relevant persons to review case information, come to a census on DNB position, and outline talking points.
 6. CDEpi, LHJ, medical healthcare providers, and additional relevant persons attend DNB call at which time CDC will decide if a DNB should be issued.
 7. If issued, CDEpi and the case will receive the DNB letter. CDEpi will send a copy of the letter to the LHJ.
