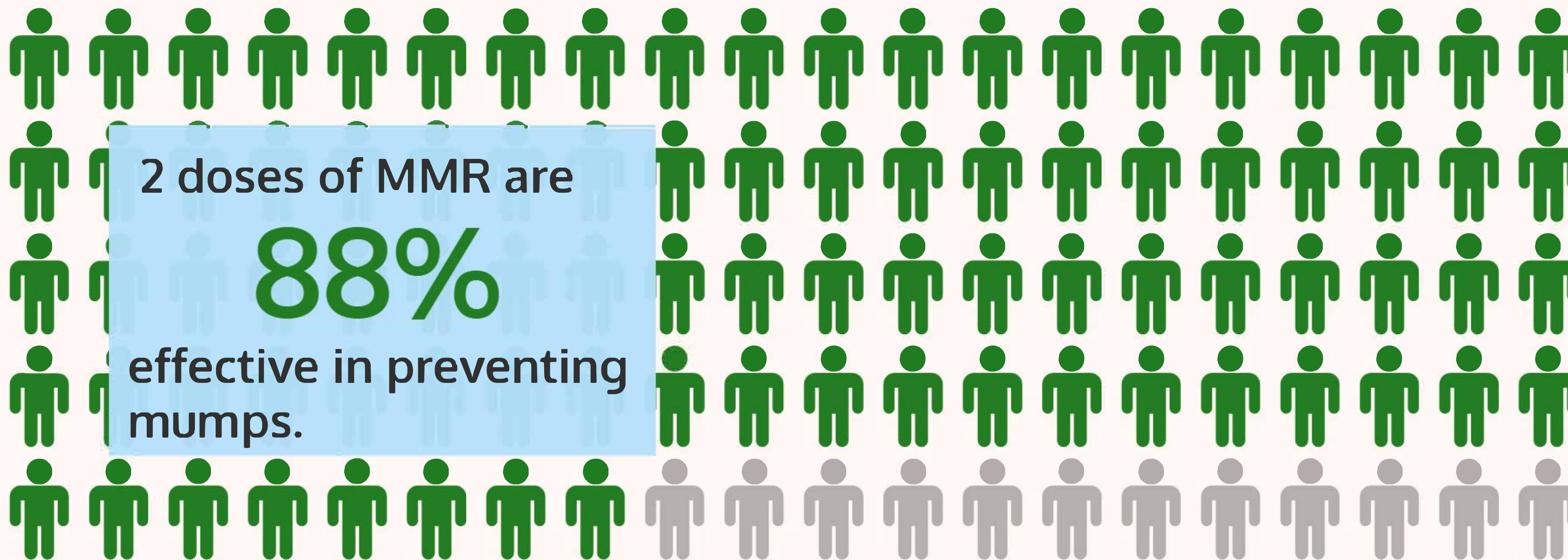


MUMPS

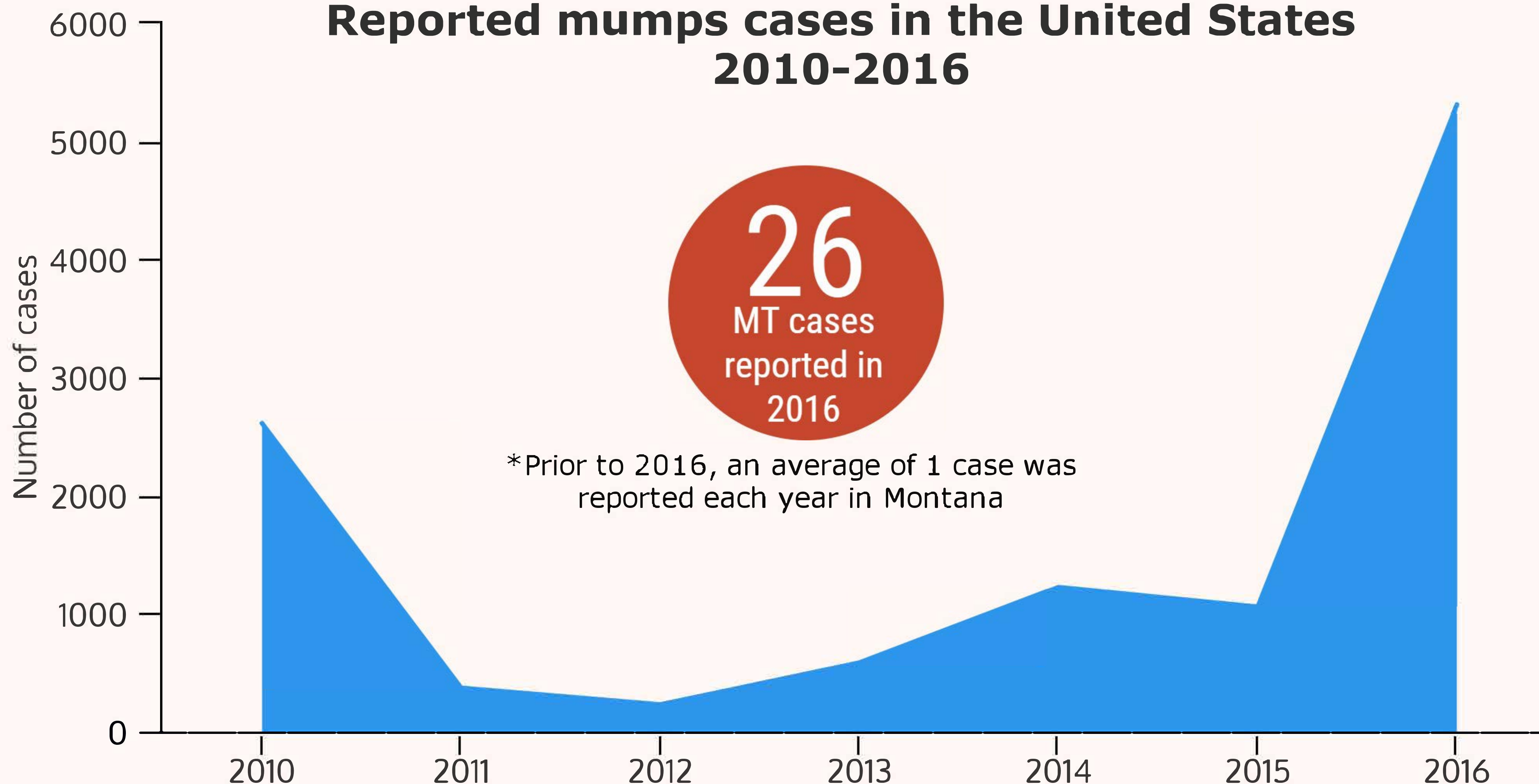


Mumps is a viral infection of the salivary glands. The virus is found in respiratory droplets and is spread by coughing, sneezing, or coming into contact with a person's saliva.

Signs and symptoms occur

16-18

days after exposure:

- Fever
- Headache
- Muscle Aches
- Tiredness
- Swollen salivary glands on one or both sides (parotitis)
- Loss of appetite

To prevent transmission, patients must stay home for

- Inflammation of the testicles (orchitis)
- Inflammation of the ovaries (oophoritis)
- Meningitis
- Encephalitis
