

- Early symptoms of syphilis may go away but the syphilis bacteria stays in your body doing more damage.
- Untreated Syphilis may cause difficulty coordinating muscle movements, paralysis and dementia, permanent blindness.
- A pregnant woman with syphilis may transmit the infection to her unborn baby.
- People who are infected always need treatment.
