## Notable Montana Communicable Disease Events of 2017

The first cases of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) were identified in Montana mule deer and white-tailed deer.

3 cases of Tuberculosis were reported: the lowest in state history.

48 cases of primary and secondary **syphilis** cases were reported; a  $\frac{243\%}{0}$  increase from 2016

The first case of documented congenital syphilis in Montana history was reported.

8,626 disease reports were received. The most commonly reported.

The most commonly reported conditions were:

- Chlamydia
- Hepatitis C
- Gonorrhea
- Campylobacteriosis


