Fundamentals of Addiction Medicine (FOAM)

The ASAM Fundamentals of Addiction Medicine is ar8-hour innovative, case-based workshop designed for providers who are relatively new to th6eld of addiction medicine, such as primary care physicians, clinicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and behavioral health specialists, who see patients at risk for or with addiction.

Addiction as a disease continues to cost the global community a staggering amount both financially and in lives lost, but there are treatments available to help patients. Participants of this workshop will learn more abouaddiction medicine and how to screen, diagnose, treat, and/or refer patients with addiction – many of whom have co-occurring medical and psychiatric comorbidities.

This is a practical, **cased based course**designed to be **interactive and engaging.** The course is designed to empower primary care and other providers to diagnose and treat patients at risk for, or with addiction, by translating the signs of the disease of addiction into transformative, positive outcomes for patients.

FREE ONLINE TRAINING

Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

SBIRT is a comprehensive, integrated, public health approach to the **delivery of early intervention** and treatment services for **persons with substance use disorders**, as well as those who are at risk of developing these disorders.

Primary care centers, hospital emergency rooms, trauma centers, and other community settings provide opportunities for early intervention with at-risk substance users before more severe consequences occur.

About SBIRT:

- -Screening quickly assesses substance use indicating necessity of a referral
- -Brief intervention focuses on increasing insight and awareness regarding substance use and motivation toward behavioral change.
- -Referral to treatment provides those identified as needing more extensive treatment with access to specialty care.



Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) 3-Hour Bootcamp

This course may be taken as an abbreviated training for those new to **prescribing buprenorphine**or as a refresher for those who have previously been trained. Also a great course for anyone working with patients witlimpiate **Use Disorder** to better **understand treatment medications**

As of January 1, 2023, any provider (MD, DO, NP, PA) can prescribe Buprenorphine products to treat their patients with opioid use disorders. This training will assist with the details of pharmacology and dosing.

IN PERSON TRAINING

Engaging Patients with Substance Use Disorder

This training focuses on the biopsychosocial (physical, emotional, and mental)changes patients experience with withdrawal and early recovery/abstinence efforts for substance use disorders. Effective evidence-based approaches for communication and patient engagement are discussed, as well as the impact of medical trauma and promoting team communication. Trauma within the healthcare, criminal justice, and social systems will be explored as a barrier to care and what we can do to improve our care interventions. Learn the history of opioids and how we ended up in an epidemic taking the lives of those we care about. Understand best practices for treating opioid use disorder, why it works, and how it is saving lives.
