NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

MAR NOTICE NO. 2025-175.1

Summary

Repeal of ARM 37.104.601, 37.104.604, 37.104.605, 37.104.606, 37.104.610, 37.104.615, and 37.104.616 pertaining to automated external defibrillators

No Hearing Scheduled

If the agency receives requests for a public hearing on the proposed rulemaking from either 10 percent or 25, whichever is less, of the persons directly affected by the proposed rulemaking; from the appropriate administrative rule review committee of the Legislature; from a governmental subdivision or agency; or from an association having not less than 25 members who will be directly affected, a hearing will be held at a later date. Notice of the hearing will be published in the Montana Administrative Register.

The estimated number of persons directly affected by the proposed rulemaking is determined to be 145 persons based on approximately 1,450 entities being registered to use AEDs in Montana.

General Reasonable Necessity Statement

The Department of Public Health and Human Services (department) is proposing repeal of the administrative rules governing Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs). The proposed repeal of these rules is necessary to implement Senate Bill (SB) 86, which was passed and enacted into law as part of Montana's 2025 legislative session. SB 86 generally revised and updated laws governing AEDs. These statutory changes included the repeal of a grant of rulemaking authority under 50-6-503, MCA, that authorized the department to promulgate administrative rules regulating AEDs. The elimination of this grant of rulemaking authority requires repeal of the AED administrative rules since there is no longer statutory authority for the rules.

Small Business Impact

Pursuant to 2-4-111, MCA, the class of small businesses affected by the proposed repeal of the rules are those small businesses utilizing AEDs. The probable significant and direct effects of the proposed repeal of the AED rules on these small businesses is that they will be able to continue to use AEDs without being subject to unnecessary regulatory requirements.

Bill Sponsor Notification

The bill sponsor contact requirements apply and have been fulfilled. The primary bill sponsor of SB 86 was notified by electronic mail on June 30, 2025.

Interested Persons
